

NEED HELP PAYING THE ENROLLMENT FEE?

The California Community Colleges Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver (BOGW) can help eligible students pay the enrollment fee in one of three ways. You can qualify for a BOGW if you are a California resident and you meet one of the following options.

OPTION 1

You or your parents are currently receiving benefits from:

- TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families),
- SSI (Supplemental Security Income),
- GA (General Assistance/General relief).

You may also qualify if you are the dependent of a disabled or deceased veteran.

TO APPLY- Fill out the application form in this insert. Bring your current year Notice of Action or a photocopy of your current or previous month's TANF, SSI, or GA payment. If you are the dependent of a disabled or deceased veteran, bring your certification from the California Department of Veteran's Affairs, or the National Guard Adjutant General.

OPTION 2

OPTION 3

You have qualified for federal or state financial aid, such as a Federal Pell Grant or Cal Grant. (The Financial Aid Office has a current FASFA on file.)

FEE EXEMPTIONS

STUDENTS WHO MAY QUALIFY FOR A FEE WAIVER OR BOARD OF GOVERNORS GRANT: If you are awarded a BOGW Grant or other form of financial aid, you MUST submit the approved award at the CASHIER'S WINDOW BEFORE registering for classes. If you do not, you must pay fees assessed during registration.

WHO QUALIFIES:

Under the guidelines established by the State of California, fee waivers may be granted to those students (or parent/guardian) who are recipients of TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families), GA (General Assistance/General Relief), or SSI/SSP (Supplemental Security Income). You may be eligible for a fee waiver if you have certification from the appropriate agency that you are a dependent of a deceased or disabled veteran or a recipient or a dependent of a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor or a dependent of an individual killed in the September 11th terrorist attacks or a dependent of a deceased law enforcement officer or fire protection personnel. Documentation to prove you are receiving benefits from one of these programs and California residency is required. Please bring one of the following:

TANF or SSI/SSP Recipients: (A) Current year Notice of Action, OR (B) TANF or SSI/SSP warrant or check issued in your name (or your parent's name) for the same month or one month before, OR (C) Untaxed Income Verification Form (may be obtained from Rio Hondo's Financial Aid Office and completed by the Welfare or Social Security Office).

General Assistance Recipients: (A) Untaxed Income Verification Form (obtained as outlined above), OR (B) Other documentation acceptable by the College and the county welfare office.

Deceased/Disabled Veterans' Dependents or National Guard Dependents: Fee Waiver certification by the California Department of Veterans Affairs or your county Veterans Service Office; or Fee Waiver certification provided by the California National Guard Adjutant General's Office.

September 11th dependents: Documentation from the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board issued in your name.

Law Enforcement and/or Fire Protection Personnel dependents: Documentation from the Public Agency that employed the decedent indicating eligibility under Education Code Section 68120

If you request a fee waiver you will be asked to sign a Fee Waiver Application under the penalty of perjury that all statements and information are correct. You must be a California resident in order to apply for these waivers. If you are applying for a Fee Waiver based on income, you must meet income and family size criteria.

You are required to provide documentation of income, such as a **2003 U.S. Income Tax Return**, if you are asked by a college official or the Chancellor's Office, California Community Colleges.
