

Academic Senate Fall 2020 Resolution 19.01 SP21

Recommendation on Full-time Temporary Faculty Policies

Whereas, The San Mateo County Community College District's (SMCCCD) current use of Full-time Temporary faculty is in violation of Education Code § 87482, thus constituting an abuse of the role of Full-time Temporary faculty;

Whereas, The use of Full-time Temporary faculty causes inequity among faculty in terms of equal access to tenure, mentorship, and job stability, thus causing harm to the morale and professionalism of the professoriate;

Whereas, The use of Full-time Temporary faculty causes instability in programs whose success depends on a dedicated Full-time faculty, the security of which cannot be guaranteed with Full-time Temporary status, thus risking harm to students enrolled in such programs;

Whereas, The SMCCCD has a duty to ensure the health and stability of programs, and the overreliance on Full-time Temporary faculty is counter to this and constitutes negligence of this duty, directly impacting outcomes for students;

Whereas, The SMCCCD's use of Full-time Temporary faculty in a manner inconsistent with Ed Code § 87482 constitutes a breach of promise to students to ensure quality programs taught by well-supported faculty;

Resolved, That the District Academic Senate requests that SMCCCD:

- 1. Cease all hiring under Ed Code § 87482 that does not comply with the codified position/discipline types and time-periods.
- 2. Work with each college's administration to convert all Full-time Temporary positions to Full-time tenure-track positions, with full credit for evaluations and time of service if a Full-time Temporary faculty is hired in the equivalent position as a tenure-track faculty, as dictated in Ed Code § 87482.
- 3. Where non-emergency Full-Time Temporary faculty have yet to be evaluated, convert to Adjunct/Part-Time Faculty, with full credit for time of service.
- 4. Duly engage in collegial consultation with local and district academic senates when developing hiring criteria, policies, and procedures for new faculty members in keeping with Ed. Code § 87360(b) and Title 5: § 53200, also known as 10+1.
