## PROGRAM DETAILS

- The AI Community of Practice (CoP) will start in Fall 2025 and will continue for the

## PARTICIPATION

- Seeking 5-8 participants, but more are welcome depending on interest and capacity.
- Participants will be asked to commit for at least one academic year, but can continue beyond that timeframe.
- Local Academic senates will be asked to share the opportunity and the District Academic Seante will formally appoint members.

## LEADERSHIP

- The CoP will be managed by the DTLC, with the co-chairs of that committee serving as the project managers.
- CoP participants will be asked to contribute presentations or serve as panelists for Flex Day sessions.

## AREAS OF FOCUS

- Develop a guide/presentation/PD module to GenAI-based tools for faculty and how they may be incorporated in some aspect of the course curriculum, complete with the pros and cons of using these tools and assessments/rubrics on the usage of those tools. Additionally, syllabus language for the course that clearly delineates how students can use AI-based tools and how they should be avoided.
- Develop a guide/presentation/PD module to AI-based tools for faculty or other employees that are to be incorporated into some aspect of their work/job duties, complete with pros and cons for the tools (e.g., Canvas AI tools).
- Develop a guide/presentation/PD module on the ethical issues raised by the use of GenAI-based tools, as a way to measure both the potential benefits and the potential concerns. This reflection should include the impact of GenAI-based tools.
