Ludmila – Concerned about employees' perception regarding working in old buildings and possible hazardous effect it may pose on their health. Michele replied that there is asbestos present in old buildings in the District. However, asbestos is only hazardous if tampered. Facilities conducts preventative maintenance periodically, installed MERV-13 filters (to trap airborne pathogens), and performs air and water quality testing regularly.
