


The Promise Scholars Program provides financial, academic and personalized student services including dedicated counseling and transportation assistance for first-time, full time students who enroll at College of San Mateo to earn a certificate or degree. The program is based on the ASAP model developed by the City University of New York which has doubled graduation rates.

O M I S O L A R 7 The Promise Scholars Program at CSM has seen clear success with its first two cohorts of 231 and 485 students respectively. Beginning in Fall 2019 the Promise Scholars Program began technical assistance to fully replicate the ASAP model, implementing all of the key components of the CUNY program and expanding to serve over 750 students in the Fall 2018 and




PROMISE SCHOLAR METRICS

The Promise Scholars Program served 485 students who demonstrated an 80% fall '18 fall '19 persistence rate - which is higher than the 75% fall to fall persistence rate of the full-time comparison group.*
