The great capital city of London, with its population over eight million, boasts culturally rich museums, libraries, famous theaters, concert halls and historic buildings. An exciting and easily maneuverable European city, London is a major political, financial and cultural center, graced with more parks and gardens than any other capital in the world.

INCLUDED

- Student housing in a homestay within a residential neighborhood of London, or a shared apartment.
- Homestays include twin-room accommodation within a residential neighborhood of London. Continental breakfast is provided daily, and students will have kitchen privileges.
- Shared student apartment/residence living with other AIFS students within the central two zones of London. Accommodation includes cooking facilities, WiFi and linens are provided.
- London travel card, valid for unlimited use on buses and underground trains in travel zones 1-3 (homestay students) or zones 1 and 2 (apartment students).
- Orientation program with AIFS staff; workshops on cultural differences, safety/security and travel; local area information; welcome reception and a half-day guided sightseeing tour of London.
- Subsidized program of extracurricular events including day trips to nearby towns or cities, walking tours, theatre and sporting events, and more.
- Membership of the Imperial College Union, giving access to 370 Union clubs, facilities, societies and various Imperial College events.
- British Life and Culture course focusing on historical, political and cultural aspects of contemporary Britain, including local field trips.
- Access to the AIFS Student Center and team of AIFS Student Services staff for information, personal advising/counseling and 24-hour emergency contact service.
- Student medical insurance policy.

OPTIONAL TRANSPORTATION PACKAGE

On a space-available basis, students may purchase the optional Transportation Package consisting of round-trip airfare between San Francisco and London and round-trip transfers overseas between the airport and student housing for \$425. Mandatory additional U.S. government and airline-imposed departure taxes, fees and fuel surcharges of \$655 (subject to change) will be billed separately.

OPTIONAL SCOTLAND WEEKEND

An optional four-day, three-night excursion to Scotland will be offered for a supplemental fee of \$625.

This includes round-trip train transportation between London and Edinburgh, three nights' hostel accommodation (one each in Edinburgh, Loch Ness and on the Isle of Skye), a three-day guided bus tour to the highlands and islands of Scotland, evening meals and the services of an AIFS staff member throughout the excursion.

Based on an enrollment of 80 participants, the fee per person is \$8,645. The AIFS program fee with accommodation in a shared apartment is \$10,195.

This fee excludes airfare, optional medical insurance upgrade (\$65), passport or visa fees if applicable, meals other than those listed, personal expenses, any California Community College tuition or administrative fees, textbooks, additional field trips or excursions required by the program faculty and anything not specified.
